



Wintertime at Kahler Glen

Wintertime is for the kid in all of us... and for winter sports enthusiasts.

Here is what you need to know to enjoy the season, to use the features, and to protect what is under the snow:

Groomed Ski Trails

These are for classic X-Country and Skate skiers **only**.

Please cross them gently if necessary.

No walking, sledding, snowshoeing, or playing on them, including the center portion.



Sledding

Sledding by residents, guests, and renters is permitted except in areas that are roped off, or where NO SLEDDING signs are posted. The ropes and signs protect sensitive golf course features and personal property.



Snowshoeing

Local volunteers maintain a network of snowshoe trails on which to explore Kahler Glen or to access other area trails. They are coincident with Shared-use paths in some areas.

Shared-use Paths

Groomed paths, approximately 4 ft wide, connect various points of interest within Kahler Glen. They are suitable for walking, snowshoeing, skiing, and pulling kids on sleds. Dogs on leashes are welcome but be prepared to clean up after them. The paths connect the northern condo complexes to the Club House, the Wildflour restaurant, ice skating, and sledding hills.



Ice Skating

Available when conditions permit and when attended. Skates are available for use. This is a volunteer-run activity and contributions are appreciated.

Do not try to skate or walk on other pond surfaces. Snow cover acts as insulation and weakens the ice below.

Parking

Please pay attention to NO PARKING signs and parking guidance for rental units. Clearing snow from streets and parking areas is a challenge and road conditions can be slippery.

The area near the ice-skating rink is a Wenatchee State Park operated SnoPark. A one-day Sno-Park permit, or a seasonal Sno-Park permit with a special groomed trail sticker is required to use that area. Please save it for others.
